- We believe we are responsible to ensure a safe environment for our students, staff and families.

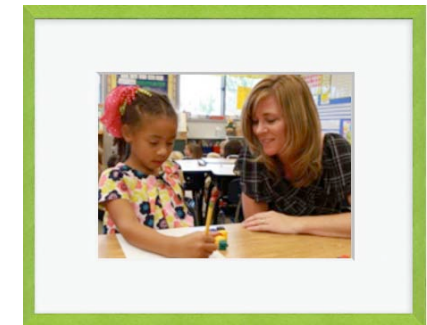
A PROUD SCHOOL DISTRICT

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MUSIC INSTRUCTION

Music instruction is offered to all students. K-4th grade students participate in music instruction led by certificated music instructors. 5th-8th grade students are eligible to join school bands. Our music program is well-known throughout the community.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The Jefferson School District employs certificated physical education teachers to work with 4th-8th grade students. K-3rd grade students are provided physical education by classroom teachers. Our students excel in physical fitness testing with over 80% achieving performance scores in the Healthy Fitness Zone, nearly 20 percentage points higher than the state average.

ARTIST IN RESIDENCE

Professional artists provide exemplary art instruction to K-8 grade students. Student projects culminate with art portfolios following the 8 week programs.

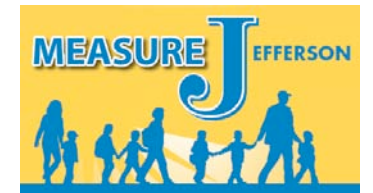


TECHNOLOGY INSTRUCTION

Each school is outfitted with a computer lab for instruction. Most classrooms are equipped with technology that enhances the learning experience for students. The district technology committee is currently developing a plan to enhance technological instruction districtwide using \$600,000 set aside by the school board.

FACILITY MODERNIZATION

We take tremendous pride in having beautiful, well-maintained facilities. The Jefferson voters approved a \$35 million dollar bond in November 2010. New fields, tracks, shade structures, courtyards and play structures have been installed. A new Jefferson School and gymnasium addition to Traina School are in planning stages.



AFTER SCHOOL SPORTS PROGRAM

Intermediate grade students are eligible to participate in the district's after school sports program. The goal is to emphasize sportsmanship, skill-building and an enjoyment of physical activity. The program is dedicated to the promotion of personal and school pride.

AWARD WINNING SCIENCE

Jefferson students are very successful at the science fairs, making up half of the award recipients in San Joaquin County in 2012. District students and staff have been honored at the State Science Fair in 2011 and 2012.
