

One of the highlights of my week is getting to lead Game Club. The concept is very simple. We open up the library. Put out various board games like Connect Four, Sorry, Battleship, and Jenga. Instead of typical recess games, students are able to come in and play with their friends in a safe environment. Originally, this idea came as a form of bullying prevention. Students had a supervised safe zone, but on Friday I realized it has evolved into so much more. Students who are working on communication and social skills can get small group assistance. Shy and new students have found a refuge where they always can find somebody to play with. GATE students are able to challenge each other in intense chess matches. It is truly a place on campus where everybody belongs and feels included. There is also a secondary benefit. For many of our students, free time means screen time. When we survey them, they are reporting that they are have 4-5 hours of screen time each day. Studies have now shown the <u>harmful effects</u> this can have on the developing brain. We are seeing those effects in live action everyday in the classroom. What Game Club shows us is that these activities are still super engaging and beneficial to children. They are also economical. For each video game purchased, you can buy 3-4 board games. It also gives parents a chance to play with their child. As you make your purchases for the holidays consider these low-tech options. The kids will love them and the time it gives them with you.

### DRESS CODE

Please review the Dress Code in our Handbook on the Jefferson District Website. Please see the graphic below for examples.

#### Per the district policy, the consequences for dress code violations are:

First offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes.

Second offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes. The student shall be assigned detention as determined appropriate by the principal or the designee.

Third offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes. The principal or the designee shall assign the student ten hours of community service to be performed within thirty calendar days.

**Fourth and subsequent offenses:** The student shall be suspended for a period of 1-5 days as determined by the principal or the designee.











The bralette, the cold shoulder style shirt, and the cut-off style shirt are recent fashion trends that have become very popular. Parents may be wondering if they are dress code compliant. Basically, with a bralette, the shirt worn on top of the bralette must meet the dress code requirements. For cold shoulder shirts, the shoulder straps must follow the 4-finger rule. For cut-off shirts, no mid-drift should be exposed. They can be worn with an undershirt to cover the mid-drift area.

Cars exiting the West Loop will be directed RIGHT onto Darlene Ln. Cars exiting the East Loop will be directed LEFT onto Darlene Ln. Walking students who need to cross Darlene Ln will do so at the designated student crossing point and will be crossed by the crossing guard.

#### Pick up procedures:

**TK & Kindergarten** – All TK and Kindergarten students are picked up from the gates next to the kindergarten building

**1**<sup>st</sup>**-3**<sup>rd</sup> **graders** – Be sure to designate your child's pick up area when you pick up your schedule or on the first day of school. COMMUNICATE CHANGES WITH YOUR CHILD'S TEACHER.

**All other students** – please communicate with your child and let them know where you will be picking them up

#### **Options for Pick up:**

Kindergarten Gate – Parents park/walk up to get their child. adult on duty must have visual contact with parent in order to release the child

Car loops – parents stay in the car and children wait in line for their parent to pull up. Please do not park your car in the carline and get out of your vehicle.

Gym doors – parents park/walk up to retrieve their child

Walkers – students are able to walk home
