What is a Mini-Monday?

In the Jefferson School District, all students are dismissed at 1:30pm. After students are released staff meets in small groups called Professional Learning Communities(PLCs) to analyze student data and collaborate on the best course of instruction for all students. This time is highly valued and critical for us to achieve our mission of ensuring ALL students learn at high levels. With 10 grade levels dismissing at the same time, it is critical that everybody follow our traffic procedures to ensure dismissal is safe and efficient. Please review the Drop Off and Pick Up routine below.

IdentaKid Visitor Management System

Our district received a grant to help implement the IdentaKid Visitor Management System. This is a where visitors scan their driver's licenses and a background check is performed against the national sex offender registry prior to receiving a visitor badge. Tardy students and students leaving campus early will also use the system to print passes. We know this is a learning process and it will take time to acclimate to the new system. We welcome any feedback or questions you may have. Please let us know how we can assist you.



Morning Drop off Procedures

Students being dropped off between 7:30-8:00am should report to the Multi-Purpose Room. Adults entering campus should report to the office to sign in and get a visitor badge. At the 8:00am bell, students should make their way to the appropriate play yard.

TK and Kindergarteners will go to the kindergarten yard. First through 4th grade students will go to the Lower Yard. Fifth through 8th grade students will go to the Upper Yard.

Our goal is to have students play independently at morning recess. Parents are welcome to accompany children to the play yards, but they must remain behind the yellow line. Younger siblings who are not Hawkins students are not allowed to play during morning recess.

There is an 8:10am bell which signals it is time to go to class. Students will make their way to their classrooms. The tardy bell rings at 8:15am, at which time the campus is closed and parents should make their way off campus. Please do not stay at your child's classroom door after the 8:15am bell.

Back to School Night - Wednesday, August 15 and Thursday, August 16

Back to School Night is an opportunity to come and meet the faculty of Tom Hawkins Elementary School. Teachers will discuss their course syllabi and important information to help your student be successful.

TK-4th Grade parents should attend on August 15th from 5:30-7:00pm. This evening begins in the MPR at 5:30 with a short welcome and orientation. Classrooms open at 6:00pm. Teachers will deliver two 25-minute presentations. If you have multiple children, you can attend either session and receive all the information.

5th-8th Grade parents should attend August 16th from 5:30-7:00pm. This evening begins in the MPR at 5:30 with a short welcome and orientation. Presentation schedules will be handed out the evening of the event.

Back the School Night is the first step in becoming an involved parent, which we know is a critical piece of the puzzle in making our students successful. We know everybody is busy, but attendance at this event is highly encouraged.

Coaching Days

A critical role school administrators play is that of an instructional leader. In order to fulfill this role effectively, administrators need time in classrooms interacting with teachers and students. DRESS CODE

Please review the Dress Code in our Handbook on the Jefferson District Website. Please see the graphic below for examples.

Per the district policy, the consequences for dress code violations are:

First offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes.

Second offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes. The student shall be assigned detention as determined appropriate by the principal or the designee.

Third offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes. The principal or the designee shall assign the student ten hours of community service to be performed within thirty calendar days.

Fourth and subsequent offenses: The student shall be suspended for a period of 1-5 days as determined by the principal or the designee.





The bralette, the cold shoulder style shirt, and the cut-off style shirt are recent fashion trends that have become very popular. Parents may be wondering if they are dress code compliant. TK & KINDERGARTEN – ALL TK AND KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS ARE PICKED UP FROM THE GATES NEXT TO THE KINDERGARTEN BUILDING

1ST-3RD **GRADERS** – BE SURE TO DESIGNATE YOUR CHILD'S PICK UP AREA WHEN YOU PICK UP YOUR SCHEDULE OR ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

ALL OTHER STUDENTS – PLEASE COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR CHILD AND LET THEM KNOW WHERE YOU WILL BE PICKING THEM UP

KINDERGARTEN GATE – PARENTS PARK/WALK UP TO GET THEIR CHILD. ADULT ON DUTY MUST HAVE VISUAL CONTACT WITH PARENT IN ORDER TO RELEASE THE CHILD

CAR LOOPS – PARENTS STAY IN THE CAR AND CHILDREN WAIT IN LINE FOR THEIR PARENT TO PULL UP. **PLEASE DO NOT PARK YOUR CAR IN THE CARLINE AND GET OUT OF YOUR VEHICLE.**
