

Car Line Etiquette

A sincere "Thank You" to all parents who are helping make the carline run smoothly. We have had a few instances over the past couple of weeks that have created unsafe and unacceptable situations in the car lines. This is elementary school pick-up. We have 4-year olds to 14-year olds trying to be dismissed and it is critical that the adults picking them up act responsibly. Adults need to follow the procedures and be role models to the 730 children who witness their actions every day. Please remember the following carline etiquette:

- **Be Courteous** It is never appropriate to yell, curse, or give gestures to others in the car line, especially to the staff, who is working diligently to keep the students safe. This type of behavior is unacceptable. The kids are watching, be good role models.
- **Stay Off Your Phone** Drivers should not be on a cell phone in the car line. It is distracted driving and it is against the law.
- **Pay Attention** –There are near misses regularly because drivers are not paying attention to their surroundings. Watch out for students at crossings and take extra care to pay attention to where you are going.
- Do Not Park Illegally That means do not park in the car line, fire lane, or parking lot lane.
 You need to find an actual, legal parking spot if you are planning on getting out of your vehicle either in the lot or on the street.
- **Follow the Rules** Everybody is busy and wants to get out of the carline quickly. If we follow the rules and work expeditiously, it only takes about 9-10 minutes to completely clear the car lines. Please review the drop off/pick up procedures below.
- **Bring Your Patience** Give students a chance to exit their vehicles with their belongings and get into their car and buckle up. Do not honk at others to get them to hurry up.

West Loop traffic flow East Loop traffic flow Designated student crossing point Please enter the pick-up loop appropriate for your child. Cars exiting the West Loop will be directed RIGHT onto Darlene Ln. Cars exiting the East Loop will be directed LEFT onto Darlene Ln. Walking students who need to cross Darlene Ln will do so at the designated student crossing point and will be crossed by the crossing guard.

TK & KINDERGARTEN – ALL TK AND KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS ARE PICKED UP FROM THE GATES NEXT TO THE KINDERGARTEN BUILDING

1ST-3RD GRADERS — BE SURE TO DESIGNATE YOUR CHILD'S PICK UP AREA WHEN YOU PICK UP YOUR SCHEDULE OR ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

ALL OTHER STUDENTS – PLEASE COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR CHILD AND LET THEM KNOW WHERE YOU WILL BE PICKING THEM UP

OPTIONS FOR PICK UP:

KINDERGARTEN GATE – PARENTS PARK/WALK UP TO GET THEIR CHILD. ADULT ON DUTY MUST HAVE VISUAL CONTACT WITH PARENT IN ORDER TO RELEASE THE CHILD

CAR LOOPS – PARENTS STAY IN THE CAR AND CHILDREN WAIT IN LINE FOR THEIR PARENT TO PULL UP. PLEASE DO NOT PARK YOUR CAR IN THE CAR LINE AND GET OUT OF YOUR VEHICLE.

IdentaKid Visitor Management System

DRESS CODE

Please review the Dress Code in our Handbook on the Jefferson District Website. Please see the graphic below for examples.


Per the district policy, the consequences for dress code violations are:

First offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes.

Second offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes. The student shall be assigned detention as determined appropriate by the principal or the designee.

Third offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes. The principal or the designee shall assign the student ten hours of community service to be performed within thirty calendar days.

Fourth and subsequent offenses: The student shall be suspended for a period of 1-5 days as determined by the principal or the designee.











The bralette, the cold shoulder style shirt, and the cut-off style shirt are recent fashion trends that have become very popular. Parents may be wondering if they are dress code compliant. Basically, with a bralette, the shirt worn on top of the bralette must meet the dress code requirements. For cold shoulder shirts, the shoulder straps must follow the 4-finger rule. For cut-off shirts, no mid-drift should be exposed. They can be worn with an undershirt to cover the mid-drift area.

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
