JEFFERSON SCHOOL DISTRICT DRESS CODE GUIDELINES



Students who are considered to be in violation of the Jefferson School District Dress Code shall be referred to the principal or the designee.

- a. First offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes.
- b. Second offense: The student's parent/guardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes. The student shall be assigned detention as determined appropriate by the principal or the designee.
- c. Third offense: The student's parent/quardian shall be contacted and may be asked to meet with school staff. The student will be required to wear loaner clothes or call home for a change of clothes. The principal or the designee shall assign the student ten hours of community service to be performed within thirty calendar days.
- d. Fourth and subsequent offenses: The student shall be suspended for a period of 1-5 days as determined by the principal or the designee.

- <u>Masks</u> Masks are optional unless you are exposed to covid or have had a recent case. Please see the guidelines below.
- Free Breakfast and Lunch We are offering FREE breakfast and lunch for all students. Students will place their orders with their classroom teachers daily. Breakfast will be served during morning recess, not before school. The cafeteria will not be serving food before school. Here is the Lunch menu. Students are still allowed to bring lunches from home. No lunch deliveries please.
- <u>Dismissal</u>- Thank you to all the families that have been following the drive through procedures. Following the directional arrows really helps keeps the cars moving.
 <u>Please do not pull through the parking area to drop off your student.</u> This causes a traffic flow issue when cars are pulling out of the drive through line.
 - Monday is a regular day. Please be sure to pick up your student on time.
 - TK-3 dismissed at 2:00
 - 4-8 dismissed at 3:00
 - Wednesday is a minimum day and all students are dismissed at 1:30
 - o If you have to change the dismissal location for your child please contact the teacher so we can be sure your child is in the correct location after school.

Student COVID Guidance

What do I do if my child has symptoms? Students with symptoms of COVID-19 infection will not be permitted to return for in-person instruction until they have met CDPH criteria to return to school for those with symptoms:

- Any student who develops new, unexplained symptoms should not return to campus until it is clear that symptoms are mild and improving or are due to a non-infectious cause (e.g., allergies). This includes waiting until 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications.
- If symptoms are concerning for COVID-19, it is strongly recommended that students wear a mask and get tested immediately.
- My child has been diagnosed with COVID-19. How long will they be out of school? Students diagnosed with COVID-19 should follow recommendations listed below (as seen in Table 1 (Persons with COVID-19) of CDPH's guidance for the general public).
- Stay home for at least 5 days after the start of symptoms (or after the date of first positive test if no symptoms).
- Isolation can end after Day 5 if symptoms are not present or are resolving AND a test collected on Day 5 or later is negative.
- If unable to test, choosing not to test, or testing positive on Day 5 (or later), isolation can end after Day 10 if fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.
- If fever is present, isolation should be continued until 24 hours after fever resolves. If symptoms, other than fever, are not resolving, continue to isolate until symptoms are resolving or until after Day 10. If symptoms are severe, or if the infected person is at high risk of serious disease, or if they have questions concerning care, infected persons should contact their healthcare provider for available treatments.
- Per CDPH masking guidance, infected persons should wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings (see masking section below for additional information).

Masking

As noted above, infected persons should isolate for five days, and mask indoors and when around others during a full 10 days following symptom onset (or positive test if no symptoms). Exposed persons should mask for 10 days following an identified close contact to someone with COVID-19, especially high-risk contacts.

All persons wearing masks should optimize mask fit and filtration, ideally through use of a <u>respirator</u> (N95, KN95, KF94) or surgical mask. See <u>Get the Most out of Masking</u> and <u>Masking Tips for Children</u> (PDF) for more information.
