### Construction

Corral Hollow Elementary School had additional parking lot stripping completed over break, additional furniture delivered, a series of artistic colts installed running through the main breezeway, security cameras, and blinds are in production for the windows. For Tracy Hills School Site #2, CDE approval is in process, PJHM continues to work on the construction documents, and we are bringing the CEQA documents tonight. For Franklyn Cole Elementary we continue to work with DTSC and the water board to get a no further action notice and for Lennar to fill in the detention basin. Once both of these are completed, we will be able to provide an updated construction timeline.

Esabel Corrie, CBO, reported increased student enrollment and bussing needs as justification for purchase of two diesel busses. Bus #1 is an 84 passenger bus and Bus #2 is 19 passenger bus to add to the Fleet in the Transportation Department.

Todd Wetherell asked what the cost was for the busses?

Esabel Corrie reported that the 84 passenger was \$288,000 and the 19 passenger was \$128,000.

Dr. Bridge reported that electric busses were not an option due to JESD not being eligible for reduced rates and the following factors; 1) Infrastructure cost, battery cost replacement is half the cost of the bus, student safety due to battery fires.


