Superintendent's Report – Dr. Bridges attended the ribbon cutting of the Discovery ChalleNGe Academy located at the Sharpe Army Depot in Lathrop on February 24th. On March 1, 2017 Dr. Bridges toured Monticello School with San Joaquin County Superintendent of Schools, James Mousalimas. March 2nd was "Read Across America" Day. a) Due to nature of the offense, the Pupil's presence causes a continuing danger to the physical safety of the Pupil or others.

In support of these conclusions, it is moved that the Board make the findings of fact which were discussed by the Board and prepared in the course of our deliberations.

It is further moved:

- 1. That Pupil 2017-03-01 shall be reviewed on or after May 26, 2017 for readmission to a District school for the first semester of 2017-2018 school year.
- 2. That during the period of the expulsion Student No. 2017-03-01 shall be provided with an alternative education program at SJCOE ONE Program.
- 3. That Pupil shall be subject to the rehabilitation plan recommended by the District.
- 4. That the Board suspend the enforcement of the expulsion if Pupil complies with the conditions recommended by the District.
- 5. That the authority to determine whether Student No. 2017-03-01 is in compliance with such conditions and to revoke the suspended enforcement of this order without further hearing be delegated to the Superintendent.

V. EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

5.1 Student Body Reports -

Sophia Alejandre, Jefferson's ASB President, presented her school's activities — This past Friday and Saturday Jefferson School had their Peter Pan production. The audience was packed and the performances were a lot of fun. Jefferson School District concert is tomorrow. The concert is being held at Jefferson with Hawkins, Traina & Traina Jefferson with the bands all performing together. Jefferson is working on their "Ship the Chip" challenge. They have to ship a chip via district mail to the other campuses while using supplies obtained from the school and staying within a budget.

Jabari Vaughn, Traina's ASB President, presented – The PTA had the Tiger Ticket store on March 3rd where students were able to make purchases with their tiger tickets. Traina's 6th grade basketball team is currently undefeated. 6th & 8th grade bands both have had field trips. Mr. Vaughn provided

information about what the students at Traina are currently studying. Some examples are; 2nd grade is finishing their dinosaur unit, 5th grade is learning about the location of all 50 states and 7th grade is learning about how to graph numbers on a scale. 7.2 2016-2017 Second Interim Report – Mindy Maxedon reviewed the Second Interim report. Second Interim includes increased budget in 1xxx (Certificated), 2xxx (Classified), and 3xxx

(Statutory benefits) related to the settlement with the Jefferson Teacher's Association and the "me too" amounts for Classified, Management & Confidential and Superintendent.

Updated LCFF revenue was noted as well as the change in the GAP rate which was confirmed at the Governor's Budget workshop in January. The change in the GAP rate results in a \$300K reduction for the District across all three years when compared to First Interim. Estimated P-2 ADA was noted as well as funded ADA for the current school year and 2 out years. Ms. Maxedon noted that the District will continue to monitor enrollment trends and will update our projections after P-2 reporting in April.
