He thanked the 5th grade teachers, administrators and Officer Abercrombie for their work in supporting the D.A.R.E. program. On April 17th he attended the California Student Mental Wellness Conference in Rocklin and learned about the many ways that mental health services are provided to students. On April 27, Dr. Bridges traveled with the 6th- 8th grade adoption committee and Sarah Steen to Newman to see how a school implemented new curriculum. IV. EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

5.1 Student Body Reports - Faythe DeLong, Monticello's Student Body President reported – This month Transitional Kindergarten presented the Three Little Piggy Opera. The 1st grade classes had their egg drop today and there was a walking field trip to Raley's to learn more about the community. The Trout Release was a big success as twenty trout were released at Shadow Cliffs on April 7th. Science Night was held at Jefferson School on April 26th and it was awesome. Students went on a field trip to Sacramento and got to visit the Governor's office. Ms. DeLong thanked the board members, Dr. Bridges and gave a special thank you to Mrs. Adair.

Sophia Alejandre, Jefferson's ASB President, presented her school's activities – Thursday before Spring Break Jefferson held the Wildcat Rally. Mr. Freitas was the winner of the Kiss the Pig contest and he had to kiss a pig. On April 24th, 5th grade students completed their D.A.R.E program. April 26th Jefferson and Monticello Schools collaborated with Sandia Labs and hosted Science Night. Students and parents from Jefferson and Monticello Schools were able to come out and practice experiments. Last week was CAASP testing and every day after testing students were rewarded with snacks. This week 8th grade students have their exit interviews. Students get an opportunity to show parents, teachers and Ms. Wooten what they know. Ms. Alejandre thanked the Board, Dr. Bridges and Mrs. Wooten for their time over the past year.

Amy Lee, Traina's ASB Secretary, shared what has been going on at Traina this month. These past few weeks have been exciting. On April 28th the ASB held a 5th-8th grade Candyland Dance. Last week the school took their CAASP exams in two subject areas. On May 5th the entire school participated in Jump Rope for Heart. Ms. Lee described what each grade level is working on; such as the Spring Sing, studying the life cycle of ants, moon phases and multiplying and dividing fractions. 8th grade exit interviews are currently being held as well.

Claire McLeod ASB Vice -President, spoke for Hawkins School. Ms. Orsi noted that Claire will be ASB President next year. On April 28th the CAASP Testing Reward Party was held for students who received a "3" or "4" on their test last year. May 1st there was a "Wild Things" presentation for the first grade students. The presentation was about different animals and students were introduced to a lemur, a Madagascar cockroach and a six-foot alligator. May 4th was Star Wars Day and lots of kids dressed up in Star Wars shirts or wore their hair like Princess Leia. Tomorrow, Hawkins School is hosting Hawkapalooza. 8th graders will have Great America, Honor's Night and the Ice Cream Social coming up.

5.2 Revise Student Suicide Prevention Board Policy BP 5141.52 & Administrative Regulation, AR 5141.52, First Reading. Dr. Bridges noted that some of the revisions to the policies focus on how to handle situations with students who have suicidal tendencies. The revisions ensure that the District has a plan in place to address how to respond to the crisis of a "cluster suicide". A second reading will take place next month.

5.4 Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) Update – Dr. Bridges reiterated the goals for the LCAP and highlighted some of the major changes. Goal 1 was consolidated down to one goal in order for the District to be able to better focus on it. The District is continuing with GLAD training and will also continuing all-day Kindergarten. One hour of aide time will be provided again this year. Goal 2.1 provides the Positive Behavior Support (PIBS) model in an effort to try and to reduce the incidence of “out of school” suspensions. Section 2.6 works on beefing up training to all staff who supervise students.
