- Sports League Dr. Bridges attended the safety meeting at Hawkins School earlier this year and discussion came up as to how teams are selected for sports. We believe it is possible to have a Jefferson District sports league where we could play teams within our district. This past season, a majority of the games were played in our district. The District was having games 2-3 times per week which made field availability for practice and development for our teams difficult. The District also had to pay for officials for these games. A District sports league would potentially have 5th and 6th grade teams and try-outs for 7th and 8th grade teams. We would consider having soccer, basketball, volleyball, and possibly other sports in the future such as cross country. If we are able to make the league work scheduling-wise, this will allow us to follow District bylaws and rules. If another team was interested in joining our league they would be able to do so. The District could consider having tournaments with neighboring districts also. Going forward, Dr. Bridges wants to get more information from the community but he wanted to present this idea to the Board for their input.

7.2 Jefferson School District 2018-2019 Budget – CBO, Mindy Maxedon, reported on the 2018-19 Budget. Mrs. Maxedon reminded the Board that we are including required reserve disclosure information which explains the reasons why the District has reserves. Economic downturns, statelevel budget cuts and future economic crises are some examples of reasons why the District maintains reserves.

A Summary of 2018-19 reserves was provided which includes:

- Mandated Cost Revenue \$386,033
- Unrestricted Lottery Ending Balance \$ 1,023,399
- Instructional Materials \$365,130
- Board Designated Reserve \$500,000

2018-19 Budget Assumptions include items reflected in the 2018-19 LCAP. The Budget Assumptions include a 2 % increase for all employees retroactive to 7/1/17-5/31/18 and ongoing from 6/1/18 forward. Changes to stipends for Masters and Special Education, Athletic Director, Athletic Coaches, Athletic Referees, were included. A PLC Level Lead stipend of \$2,250 was added as well as, a Middle School ASB Leadership stipend of \$1,000. The stipend changes noted above will go into effect for the 2018-19 school year.

We are funded as of last year's P-2. The budget reflects an increased contribution to Special Education as County SELPA revenue has decreased and the Mental Health savings have been used up. The District is looking at new enrollment and will present plans as we move forward. Mrs. Maxedon noted that she will be closing the 2017-18 books in August and Unaudited Actuals will be presented in September 2018. The 2018-19 Beginning Balance will be finalized then.

7.3 Jefferson School District Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), Year 2018-2019 – The LCAP is a three-year living document that the District uses to meet goals in a "stair step" process.

There are a few minor changes to the 2018-19 LCAP. The District is required to have proportionality for English learner, socio-economically disadvantaged and foster youth included. The District benchmarked programs to ensure proportionality was met with a list that includes TK/K aides, instructional coaches, buy back days, intervention specialists, EL staff, and PLC time, which will help to ensure teachers are working toward the goal of improving our services to all students. Some of the terminology in the LCAP has changed and those changes are highlighted in bold. The Second Step Program, which is social-emotional learning skills program, was added district wide. This program could help to decrease the number of students in the District who are referred for counseling services.
