Superintendent's Report – The week of February 25th, Dr. Bridges participated in Read Across America Week. On March 4th he met with PJHM Architects and looked over eight possible layouts for the upcoming Corral Hollow Elementary School. On March 8th Dr. Bridges met with a team of 5th – 8th grade math teachers and administrators to review the advanced math program. The group discussed the current program and looked at possible changes to strengthen the program. On Monday Dr. Bridges and Sarah Steen met with the 6th - 8th grade Social Studies textbook adoption committee. The group decided to recommend National Geographic Textbook for adoption next year. Finally, Dr. Bridges congratulated the Jefferson School students, staff, and parents on Jefferson School being named a California Distinguished School for 2019. 167 middle and high schools were selected and only 5 of them were in San Joaquin County. 7.2 2018-2019 Second Interim Report – CBO, Mindy Maxedon presented the Second Interim report. Interest budgets were revised across all funds as interest rates have increased slightly and the local revenue was adjusted up slightly as well. Routine Repair and Maintenance was lowered to return Resource 8150 to 2% of general fund expenditures for the 2018-19 year. Backed out the one-time budgets for district and site projects in Resource 0700 for the 2019-2020 school year on the assumption that the projects will be complete by year's end. Budget was added in Resource 7311 for the Classified Professional Development Grant. Reduced the Special Education contribution by \$65,180 as some positions ended up filling with less expensive staff. Additional revenue was received from the SELPA as well. The District is planning to be down roughly 140 students as a cautionary change due to the IDA policy change with neighboring district, as well as a large outgoing eighth grade class & lower numbers in incoming Kindergarten and TK classes. The report confirms that the district is positively certified through the 2020-2021 school year based on the current assumptions outlined.
