TEACHING STUDENTS OF LIMITED-ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

The Board of Trustees recognizes that the recruitment, development and retention of an adequate number of qualified instructors and assistants is essential to the success of program for student of limited English proficiency. The Board shall take action, within budgetary constraints, to provide personnel who are competent to properly assess and skillfully instruct students of limited English proficiency.

LEP competencies shall be determined either by their credentials or by their meeting district criteria which have been approved by the State Department of Education.
