Dear Jefferson Families,

WOW!!! College week was a blast! I can't explain the level of the spirit, energy, and interest that the students and staff had this past week. One thing in particular that took place this year was a college week assembly to inspire, inform, and teach students how to be involved in their decision making and planning for college. Students were provided information about attending college, given resources on how to start preparing for college as a middle school student, as well as learned statistics of the benefits of furthering their education.

Also this past week, traffic has been running smoother and your support is appreciated. The San Joaquin County Department of Public Works and Transportation Engineering recently visited our school to assess our traffic flow in the afternoon. To ensure the safety of all, the County will be implementing changes to our current drop-off and pick-up procedures. They are placing "No Parking" (or standing of vehicle) signs along the inbound turn lane on Linne Road. After signage is up, the County will also have CHP in the area during drop-off and pick-up hours to check that cars are not waiting in the turn lane on Linne Road or in the driving lane on Chrisman Road. Please do your part by parking in the parking lots if you are arriving prior to 3:00pm and the drive through lane is full. We cannot have cars sticking out into the street. Your child can walk across the crosswalks to your car. This will adequately clear the two areas in which cars are currently waiting. Once the bell rings, traffic can flow through the drive through lane as usual. Thank you for your cooperation.

**ELAC:** California Education Code Section 62002.5 requires that an ELAC be established at each school where there are 20 or more identified English Learner (EL) students. The responsibilities of this committee are to advise the school on various EL issues, services and programs and to elect a representative to the District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC). The first ELAC meeting will be September 28<sup>th</sup> at 3:30 in our Media Room.

**SSC**: The Jefferson School Site Council researches strategies and procedures to support the school in its improvement efforts. The council helps develop, implement and evaluate a school plan that coordinates the application of categorical funds based on the requirements of the School-Based Program Coordination Act. The School Site Council provides all students, including students with special needs, with an enriched instructional program at Jefferson School. Our first meeting will take place on October 5<sup>th</sup> at 3:20 in the Media Room. Furthermore, we will be selecting officers at this time.

Progress Reports were sent home last Friday. Please use the information as an opportunity to sit with your child and discuss their goals for the remainder of the trimester. Parent Teacher Conferences will be taking place the week of October 17<sup>th</sup>. Individual letters will be mailed home soon with your appointment time and information regarding specifics for the process for conferences.


