Dear Jefferson Families,

We always hear "breakfast is the most important meal of the day." We have learned that this is true, however it doesn't always happen. For our students, this is especially important. Eating a healthy breakfast can improve a number of things for our students such as:

Energy: Along with sleep and exercise, breakfast is one of the best ways to refuel and have energy for the day.

Improved Concentration: Studies suggest that eating a healthy breakfast improves brain function — particularly memory and recall. This is essential for soaking up new knowledge and applying it later for a big exam.

Better Grades: Research shows students who eat breakfast perform better academically. It's not fully understood why, but scientists believe it may be because breakfast supplies essential nutrients to the nervous system to rev up brain power. Or the explanation could simply be that breakfast alleviates hunger and a rumbling tummy, which can interfere with academic performance, behavior and self-esteem.

Creating Healthy Habits: Help your student make good choices now and in return, those choices will become life-long habits. Eating breakfast is proven to help reduce the chances of obesity.



Dear Jefferson School District Parents, Guardians and Community Members:

Three years ago the State of California overhauled the way schools were financed by implementing the Local Control Funding Formula. This new system is designed to provide more local control over spending to help all students achieve high standards, provide schools with exceptional climates, and involve parents and the community as active participants in student learning. Districts were required to develop Local Control Accountability Plans (LCAP) and update them annually utilizing community input.

As part of our district's continuing effort to acquire community input on the LCAP, Jefferson School District will hold a community forum to provide an annual update of progress and seek feedback to incorporate into the plan. At the forum you will have the opportunity to provide input on conditions of learning, student achievement, and student/parent engagement. Over the past few years, Jefferson School District has implemented a number of efforts to address these areas, but we know more work needs to be done.

The forum will be at Anthony Traina School on February 15, 2017 from 6:00 – 7:00 pm in the multi-purpose room.

GATE – OLSAT Testing Spring 2017 GATE Testing

Spring Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) testing is open to all second through seventh graders who have not taken the OLSAT 8 in the past three years. Testing will occur after school at your child's school site. The testing schedule can be found below. Parents are responsible for student transportation. If you would like your child to participate in the upcoming GATE testing, please contact the school office and ask for a GATE application or go to the Jefferson School District Website (www.jeffersonschooldistrict.com).
