Dear Jefferson Families,

I hope your week off with your family was enjoyable and full of thanks! In our last newsletter you were encouraged to read through an article with your child about staying organized, time management, and setting goals for the second trimester.

Let me keep you up to date with our goals here at Jefferson School. At the November Board Meeting, our School Site Plan was presented. We are working on the following goals this year: enhancing our positive incentives for student behavior; maintaining a safe school by purchasing items to help secure the school in case of an emergency; enhancing our extension activities such as GATE classes, intervention programs, STEM (Science Technology Engineering Mathematics) electives; enhancing music and art classes through offerings and outside of school activities; and raising CAASPP scores in both ELA and Mathematics by 5% overall in 2016-2017 and then again in 2017-2018. We are working towards these goals by implementing several action plans. Teachers are meeting weekly to discuss essential standards and discuss what students are learning; we are purchasing STEM based items for our elective classes; we have a team of 8 members attending a 2-year training regarding Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS), just to name few.
