A note from the Principal ~

Dear Jefferson Families,

Our annual state testing is right around the corner. We will be measuring our progress by participating in the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP). These tests are for grades 3-8 and test the areas of English Language Arts/Literacy and Mathematics. In addition to the CAASPP assessments, students in Grades 5 and 8 will also be taking a paper-pencil Science assessment during the same testing window. Our 7th & 8th grade students will be testing April 12 – April 22 and the 5th & 6th grade students will be testing April 25 – May 6.

It is extremely important that our students attend school every day of test, get plenty of sleep every night, and have a healthy breakfast each morning. We will be providing snacks and activities for our students during the testing weeks to keep them motivated.

Our teachers have been challenging students to provide reasoning, support arguments with evidence, and persevere in solving problems. These are all of the skills that our students need to develop over the course of their education to succeed in the long run.

Some highlights of the CAASPP assessments are:

- Computer Based: Some questions are interactive, and a greater variety of supporting tools can be provided to eligible students, such as magnification of text, and text-to-speech read-aloud of questions.
- Computer Adaptive: Students receive test questions that help pinpoint what they know and can do. A correct answer is followed by a more difficult question, and an incorrect answer is followed by an easier question. This provides a more precise estimate of student understanding.
- Realistic Context for Tasks: Knowledge is assessed in context—for example, students are asked to select a word of the same meaning to replace a word in a paragraph, rather than to choose a synonym for a word standing alone. In addition, students will need to provide open-ended answers for some questions, rather than selecting from multiple options, and will be asked to write short essays that will need to be scored by hand.
- No Time Limits: Students can take the time they need to do their best.




