#### **TB Testing for Volunteers:**

To help volunteers comply with the requirement to have a TB clearance, we are hosting a one day opportunity for volunteers to come in and receive the clearance at no cost. It will be held on Tuesday, October 27 from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM to 4:00PM on a drop in basis at the District Office in the board room. Volunteers will complete the Risk Assessment Questionnaire which will then be evaluated by a Registered Nurse who will issue a Certificate of Completion if it determined that no risk factors exist. This certificate will be valid for four years. If a person is identified with risk factors, they will need to obtain a TB test from a medical professional at their own cost.

- : very clear and complete : leaving no doubt about the meaning
- : showing or referring very openly to nudity, violence, or sexual activity

Full Definition of EXPLICIT

1 *a*: fully revealed or expressed without vagueness, implication, or <u>ambiguity</u>: leaving no question as to meaning or intent <*explicit* instructions>

- *b* : open in the depiction of nudity or sexuality <*explicit* books and films>
- 2: fully developed or formulated <an *explicit* plan> <an *explicit* notion of our objective>
- 3: <u>unambiguous</u> in expression <was very *explicit* on how we are
