Dear Jefferson Families,

This past week I was able to go to each classroom and talk with the students. We discussed handbook items but more importantly our Jefferson Creed and emphasis this year on character education. We believe in our Creed: Be Responsible, Do Your Best Each Day, Think Before You Speak, Put Others First, and Avoid Conflict. Students are recognized on a daily basis for following the Jefferson Creed and are given Creed Tickets for going above and beyond. Every Monday 5 students per grade level are drawn from the raffle of tickets and earn prizes for their efforts. Furthermore, we will continue implementing our character education program, Second Step. Every child will engage in weekly lessons regarding skills for learning, empathy, bullying, harassment, discrimination, emotional management, and problem solving. Please talk with your children about Jefferson Creed and making every day count.

Drop Off and Pick Up went quite well, however please read the information below to ensure all cars are following our procedures.

### Morning Drop Off Procedures

The morning drop off went smoothly this week. Please remember that you may use the back drop off loop located on Chrisman Road.

#### Afternoon Pick Up Procedures

It is normal for traffic to be congested at the beginning of the school year, but it gets better after the first week. Please make sure you are following our procedures to ensure the safety of our children and allow for the traffic to run as smoothly as possible. We do not want students entering cars that are parked on either Chrisman Road or Linne Road. Please utilize the parking spaces in the lots and your child can use the cross walk and to get to your car.

Below are some options to help streamline traffic in the front lot for afternoon pick up.

- Remind your child to leave class and immediately walk to the parking lots for pickup.
- Park in the front or back lot and your child can use the cross walk to get to your car.
- Arrive 5 minutes after dismissal. This will allow time for the lot to clear.
- If possible, utilize carpooling.
