Our students were so engaged during our first WIN (What I Need Session). Every Thursday, students are provided enrichment and intervention courses that are outside of their normal schedule. We run a 2:00 bell schedule,



allowing an hour session for students to choose from courses, switch classes and then have approximately 45 minutes of a different course. This past Thursday, teachers and staff made this such an inspirational and exciting time. They participated in GATE course



learning about the ecosystem, used coding on the computer to solve puzzles in a Breakout Edu course, attended Book Frenzy Rounds in the library where they found books that sparked their interest, and even participated in a self-led lesson for test prep in math intervention. The excitement and engagement of the students, and the passion and energy the staff put into tailoring these weekly lessons is incredible to see.

Our Monticello Jefferson Carnival is also right around the corner, Friday, October 25th from 3:00 – 7:30pm at Monticello School. Our teachers will be putting together auction baskets as a fundraiser for our students and more information regarding auction baskets will come home soon. This event raises funding to run our biggest programs at our schools and the auction baskets bring in a large portion of that funding. Furthermore, a large portion of the funds come from donations.
