First and foremost, I hope everyone in your family is well. According to your response to the Jefferson School District Survey, you have elected for your child to remain in Distance Learning for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year. This information pertains to 5th and 6th grade students only. As we receive more information regarding 7th & 8th grade students, we will communicate with families and students.

Your child will maintain their current schedule and classes, five days a week. As a reminder, **schools starts promptly at 8:25am**. Please make the necessary arrangements to ensure your child is prepared with all of their materials upon logging in to their Zoom session in an effort to maximize the time spent with the teachers. Beginning March 3, 2021, families electing for In-Person learning will begin sending their children to school. In-Person students as well as Distancing Learning students will be receiving instruction simultaneously. We ask for your patience as we teach them campus safety protocol and routines. Furthermore, due to more students being on campus, break times will be staggered, which could affect your child's ten minute break time.

We will continue to place a great emphasis on social and emotional development, as well as providing an environment rich in academics.
